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## Your Wedding at Faith Lutheran Church

Thank you for allowing us at Faith Lutheran Church to assist you in the planning of your wedding service. Here is how we can help you:

1. We can help make your wedding a worship service where you, your family and your guests can celebrate God's love for us through Jesus Christ as we thank God for the gift of love in marriage.
2. Our pastoral staff, partnering with local marriage and family resources, can help you prepare for marriage in the context of the Christian faith.
3. Our wedding coordinator can answer many of your questions about the specifics for your wedding ceremony. She will also conduct your wedding rehearsal.
4. Our organist can assist you in selecting from a broad repertoire of music that will reflect your taste and be appropriate for a worship service.

We consider it a privilege to serve you in the planning of your service, for we believe that God has made a special investment in you and in your love for each other. We want your wedding day to be a joyful and blessed celebration, a reflection of God's love for you.

The rest of this guide contains many helpful details and guidelines as you plan your wedding. Please call the church office if you have questions. May you experience God's blessings in all of your preparations!

# About Marriage

Choosing to be married in the Church is a reflection of your Christian faith and recognition that the Church is the community where Christians gather to worship, learn, witness, and serve. It is also recognition that the Church is your spiritual home and the place where many important steps in your life are celebrated and affirmed. Finally, you are stating that Jesus Christ and the Church will be a part of your life-long commitment to each other.

With your upcoming marriage it is important to recognize that much more is happening than simply a wedding ceremony, important as that is. You are being married. The wedding is the public celebration of your life-long commitment before God and to one another. It begins the marriage. You are invited to make your focus not so much on the wedding as on the marriage.

Marriage has been around since the beginning of time! There is nothing essentially "Christian" about it. People of all faiths and cultures join in marriage. And yet, we as Christians celebrate the holiness of marriage by joining husband and wife together under the blessing of God.

## **Covenant**

Marriage is essentially a Covenant of Fidelity between a man and a woman made with society's sanction and grounded in the steadfast love of God. As God is faithful to us, so we can be faithful toward each other in love.

Marriage is also a Social Contract, the basis of which is the **commitment** that the man and woman make to each other. Contrary to popular understanding, the basis in marriage is not just romantic love, for such love is changeable. You cannot promise to be 'in love' years hence, but you can make a loving commitment to each other. For people, faithfulness and romantic love do not necessarily go together. But in God the two are joined! Marital vows of fidelity grounded in the love of God will abide forever.

## **The Marriage**

It is not the pastor who performs the marriage, but the wedding couple. Both the Church and State have an interest in marriage. But the marriage itself is conducted by the two partners. Their vows of faithfulness and commitment serve as the heart of their marriage. In the wedding service, they ask for God's blessing and support.

# First Steps

## **Who Can Be Married at Faith Lutheran Church?**

Faith Lutheran pastoral staff and building are available for member weddings. Weddings may be scheduled by members and those who are actively worshipping and scheduled to attend a membership class. Non-member weddings are held only with approval of the senior pastor.

## **The Date and The Pastor**

Call the Church Office (763-755-3530) as early as possible to see if the date you have selected is available for your wedding. A \$100 deposit is required to hold your reservation.

We have three pastors at Faith Lutheran Church. The pastor you will work with will depend on the date you have selected. You may request a particular pastor and you will be notified if the pastor is available to work with you. If you would like additional clergy to participate, please first contact the pastor from Faith Lutheran who is presiding at your service.

Marriages are not celebrated during Holy Week and certain other dates according to availability.

## **Building Use**

Because of the need to schedule more than one wedding per Saturday, we offer the following times for your wedding

1:00, 4:00 or 7:00 PM

Your scheduling of Faith Lutheran Church for your wedding gives you 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  hours use of the church. This time is divided in the following manner; (i.e., 4:00 PM wedding)

$\frac{1}{2}$  hours for dressing, (1:30 - 2:00 PM)

1  $\frac{1}{2}$  hours for pictures and preparing for the service (2:00 - 3:30 PM)

$\frac{1}{2}$  wedding party in dressing rooms and ushers on duty (3:30-4:00 PM)

$\frac{1}{2}$  hour for the service (4:00 - 4:30 PM)

$\frac{1}{2}$  hour for receiving line (4:30-5:00 PM)

Dressing areas must be vacated and cleaned out after ceremony. Any belongings found will be kept for one week. If not claimed they will be donated to charity. Dressing areas are monitored and secured by custodial staff. Faith Lutheran Church is not responsible for any items that may be lost or stolen.

Should you require pictures to be taken after the wedding and staff and the building are available, a fee of \$150 will be charged for one additional hour after your allotted building time.

- Wedding gowns cannot be kept at the church prior to the wedding day.
- We do not allow the throwing of rice, birdseed, flower petals or the releasing of balloons or butterflies.
- The nursery area is not available for weddings.

### **Wedding Coordinators**

You will be assigned a wedding coordinator who will contact you within three weeks of scheduling your wedding. Your first meeting will be three months before your wedding date.

### **Preparatory Sessions**

All couples who are being married at Faith Lutheran are required to attend a pre-marital workshop. Workshops will be held several times a year at various north metro ELCA churches. A schedule is available online at [kstevensen24@gmail.com](mailto:kstevensen24@gmail.com), and you will register on that website also. The workshop fee is \$100. You will also complete a pre-marriage inventory (Prepare), and meet with the pastor to discuss the results as well as plan for your ceremony. The fee for the inventory is \$35. Contact the pastor 6 months prior to your wedding date to schedule a feedback and preparatory session.

The preparatory session not only sets the wedding in the context of God's Word and wisdom, but gives the pastor an opportunity to become better acquainted with you and to address any special issues you may face in your future life as a married couple.

### **Musicians**

The organist at Faith Lutheran (Angie Doty, 763-443-8432 or [angiedoty@comcast.net](mailto:angiedoty@comcast.net)) normally plays at all weddings where organ or piano music is desired. The organist will meet with you to choose music for your wedding. Please contact the church organist at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to arrange for a meeting. Should you desire a different organist or pianist, arrangements and approval must first be made through the Faith Lutheran wedding coordinator.

You may provide your own soloist, and if you should need additional rehearsal time other than the time just prior to the service, arrangements must be made directly with the organist for an additional fee. If you would like to use a Faith Lutheran soloist, please contact the church office.

### **Wedding Music Policies**

Faith Lutheran views a wedding service as a sacred ceremony within the context of a worship service. It is our intent that the music chosen for the wedding ceremony be supportive and consistent with the sacred nature of the service. Consequently, all music must be scripture based. Secular love songs do not meet with the criteria mentioned above. A list of suggested wedding music, both traditional and contemporary can be provided by the Wedding Secretary in the church office or your Wedding Coordinator. All selections not listed must be submitted for approval to the presiding pastor at least one month before the wedding date.

### **The License**

Minnesota law requires couples to secure a license to marry. By law, application for this license must be made a minimum of five days before the wedding and up to six months prior at any Clerk of Courts office in the state. Only one person need apply, but he/she must have proof of age for both persons. **When you have completed both the pre-marriage workshop and the Prepare inventory, you will receive a certificate for a reduced fee marriage license, a savings of \$70.** Please note that we require that the license be brought to the church office 30 days before the wedding. The license and souvenir copies will be signed by the presiding pastor, maid/matron of honor and best man after the wedding ceremony. They will be given to the maid/matron of honor who will be responsible to give them to the couple.

### **Invitations**

If you wish to invite the pastor to your rehearsal dinner or to the wedding reception, please extend a written invitation. With the amount of weekend commitments, pastors are often not able to attend rehearsal dinners and wedding receptions. A written prayer is available from the wedding coordinator for your use for the blessing of the meal at a wedding reception.

### **Rehearsal**

The time and availability of the church building for the rehearsal must be arranged with the wedding coordinator as far in advance as possible. It is important that the rehearsal begin at the scheduled time. Rehearsals do not last more than an hour - if you wish extra time for decorating, etc., please make arrangements with the church office ahead of time. The rehearsal will cover a walk through of movements with the wedding party, the usher and reader responsibilities, a review of the time schedule and a look at the dressing areas.

### **Flowers and Decorations**

Please coordinate the delivery of flowers with the time the building has been reserved for the wedding, or make special arrangements with the church office. We have two candelabra available for your use, for a \$25 restocking fee for the candles. If you desire a unity candle or aisle runner (75 ft.), you must purchase them on your own. Removal responsibilities should be completed by the ushers or families (see attached policies for Florist and provide copy to them.)

### **Aisle Runner**

Aisle runners became a wedding custom when churches had wood or stone floors, and protection was needed to keep the wedding gown from becoming soiled. Our church sanctuary is carpeted, eliminating the need for an aisle runner. Aisle runners have also proven to be a tripping hazard for both the wedding party and guests, thus we discourage their use at Faith Lutheran Church.

### **Bulletins**

It is helpful, but not necessary to have printed bulletins for your wedding service. Bulletins inform your guests as to the order of the service and identify the participants. A sample bulletin is available at the back of this booklet. Bulletins are not prepared by Faith Lutheran Church. **You must submit a draft of your bulletin for approval to the presiding pastor at least one month prior to your wedding date.**

### **Photography/Videography**

We recommend that all formal pictures be taken before the ceremony and must conclude 30 minutes prior to the start of the service. Lights/flash may not be used during the ceremony, with the exception of the wedding party processional and recessional. Video cameras may be used without additional lights during the service, provided the videographer speaks to the wedding coordinator prior to set up to ensure they are placed unobtrusively. Photographers are expected to abide by the instructions of the church wedding coordinator. (See attached policies for Photographer/Videographer and provide a copy to them)

### **Church Seating**

The sanctuary seats 750 people comfortably. There are 5 sections of pews with 10 rows of pews on each side of the center aisle.

## Church Policies

Faith Lutheran Church is not responsible for personal items that are lost or stolen while you are in the church or on church property. While we do our best to help by locking doors, we need your help to ensure the safety of your purses, cameras, etc. Likewise, gifts that are brought to the wedding are not the responsibility of the church. Someone should be in charge of the gifts, purses and cameras at all times. You should appoint a person/party who will be responsible for removing your items from the church (alter flowers, decorations, programs, maps, guest book, personal items, etc...) The church must be left in the same condition you found it.

**The use of alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs on the church grounds or premises is strictly prohibited. Smoking is only allowed outside; please extinguish your cigarette in the appropriate receptacle located outside the church.**

# The Wedding Service

The typical order of worship is outlined below. A copy is found later in this booklet. Please review the service. At the Pastor's discretion, additions and changes can be made in the service as long as they are liturgically and theologically appropriate.

## **The Order of Service**

The following outline may be used in order to develop a bulletin for your wedding worship service. A sample bulletin is included on the next page.

*Lighting of the Unity Candle (optional)*

*Hymn, Solo, or Instrumental during lighting of the unity candle*

Blessing of the Marriage

Prayers

The Lord's Prayer (spoken or solo)

Benediction

Introduction of the Couple

Recessional (organ, instrumental, or congregational hymn)

Postlude

## Bible Readings

Because marriage is a gift from God and the Christian marriage service is also a statement of faith, we ground the celebration and the promises of marriage in God's holy word. Unless approved by the presiding pastor, the readings in your service should be from the Bible.

Generally there are two or three Bible readings. You may choose to have a person or persons significant to you read the scriptural passages, or the pastor may read them.

The texts you choose for your wedding will reveal something about your relationship. The list below is suggested passages. Please keep in mind the following in choosing your passages: What drew you to select these passages? How does this passage speak to your shared commitment and your hopes for the future? How does the passage speak of God's blessings and God's activity in marriage? Does it reveal a vision for your married life? Be sure to share with the pastor why you have chosen the texts you have.

## The Vows

The vows and promises that you make to one another are at the center of the wedding service. It is by your promises that you bind yourselves together as husband and wife. You may choose from the following options for the wording of your promises or you may adapt the wording in consultation with the pastor.

1) I take you, \_\_\_\_\_, to be my wife/husband from this day forward, to join with you and share all that is to come, and I promise to be faithful to you until death parts us.

2) I take you \_\_\_\_\_, to be my wife/husband, and these things I promise to you: I will be faithful to you and honest with you; I will respect, trust, help and care for you. I will share my life with you. I will forgive you as we have been forgiven; and I will try with you to better understand ourselves, the world and God through the best and the worst of what is to come as long as we both shall live.

3) I take you, \_\_\_\_\_, to be my wife/husband. I promise before God and these witnesses to be your faithful husband/wife, to share with you in plenty and in want, in joy and in sorrow, in sickness and in health. I promise to forgive and strengthen you, and to join with you so that together we may serve God and each other as long as we both shall live.

4) I take you \_\_\_\_\_ to be my wife/husband from this day forward; to join with you and share all that is to come. To give and to receive, to speak and to listen, to inspire and to respond, and in all of our life together to be loyal to you with my whole life and with all my being until death parts us.

## **The Service of Marriage**

C **We will.**

*OPTION: When pastorally appropriate, one or both of these questions may be used  
when children are brought into the family of those to be married.*

P *Name and name, will you be faithful and loving parents to name/s?*  
R **We will.**

*The minister may ask the children:*

P *Name/s, will you help name and name in their marriage?*  
R **We will.**

### GIVING OF RINGS

P: The rings are a symbol of unity which demonstrates the unity that *name* and *name* share with each other and which the Lord shares with them. Just as the rings have no beginning and no end, so does God's love for us. May these rings be blessed and may *name* and *name* be blessed as they live in unity with each other and with the Lord.

*Name, I give you this ring as a sign of my love and faithfulness.*

### ACCLAMATION

P Name and name,  
by their promises before God and in the presence of this assembly,  
have bound themselves to one another as husband and wife.  
Those whom God has joined together let no one separate.

We bless you for the joy which your servants, name and name, have found in each other,

Pour down your grace upon name and name, that they may fulfill the vows they have made this day and reflect your steadfast love in their lifelong faithfulness to each other.

As members with them in the body of Christ, use us to support their life together, and from your great store of strength, give them power and patience, affection and understanding, courage, and love toward you, toward each other, and toward the world.

We also pray that you would bless name and name, as a family, as well as bless all families throughout the world. Enrich all husbands and wives, parents and children more and more with your grace, that strengthening and supporting each other, they may serve those in need and be a sign of the fulfillment of your perfect kingdom.

# Wedding Checklist & Timeline

- At earliest possible time, reserve a date through the Faith Lutheran Church office.
  - Submit your deposit and registration form to hold your wedding date
    - A Faith Lutheran Church Wedding Coordinator will contact you within three weeks
    - Via email, you will receive the Faith Lutheran Wedding Guide
  
- 6-9 months
  - You should attend a premarital workshop (to see dates and register go to [www.karenstevensen.com](http://www.karenstevensen.com))
    - Via email, you will receive the online Prepare inventory to complete at your earliest convenience
    - Via email, you will receive confirmation of the Pastor and Wedding Coordinator appointed to your wedding.
  
- 6 months
  - Call the pastor to schedule a Prepare feedback and preparatory session
  - Contact organist to confirm wedding date and schedule meeting
  
- 3 months
  - Wedding Coordinator will contact you to schedule a meeting to review wedding book and assist you with your wedding plans
  - Meet with organist to select your music
  
- 30 days
  - Bring your marriage license to the church office (include names of best man and maid/matron of honor.)
  - Submit bulletin to pastor for approval
  - Submit fee payment to the church office. Pastoral honorarium fee may be included at this time, if desired.
  
- 1 week
  - Wedding coordinator will contact you to finalize your ceremony plans
